President's Message

This is a combined message from the President, the Treasurer and the Property Manager for the past quarter. We had a very successful season the past few months. Much was accomplished and many activities were held - all within the IBC budget for the year.

From the property side, the landscaping continues to improve following the hurricane of last year. Several volunteers contributed their time to improving the Building 120 atrium landscaping. This is being done on a test basis to see how the plantings look over the summer. Several of our owners were able to locate many coral rocks, at no cost, to spruce up the look in the atrium. The rocks add color to the atrium and they do not need to be watered to keep them looking good. If successful, we'll do the same for the 140 atrium next Fall. More in the next issue.

We are looking to improve the maintenance of the irrigation system by hiring an irrigation contractor rather than have World Class Landscaping employ a subcontractor. This should improve the overall reliability of that important system as well as help conserve water through better maintenance.

Work will continue over the next few months replacing several of the damaged curved glass panels on unit balconies. Over the

summer, we plan to have all of the exterior kitchen and bathroom vents checked for proper screening. We have found that birds are nesting in a few of the vents. All missing screens will be replaced.

Through the first quarter of the year our IBC finances continue to be on track as compared to budget. Unlike the past couple of years, there are no major projects scheduled during the summer season this year. We know that our year-round residents will appreciate the reduced noise and activity they have experienced the past couple of years.

Socially, this past season had many successes. The Tuesday evening social hour was always well attended, except for those dratted rainy Tuesdays.

Almost everyone was very happy with the outcome of the Super Bowl with the underdog Philadelphia Eagles taking the victory over the New England Patriots. At IBC, Joe Micheli was the big winner with the correct final score box in the IBC pool taking home \$100. The big winner in the NCAA basketball pool was also Joe Micheli. No one knows quite how he does it.

Finally, the End of the Season party was a huge success. Patty and Gary Weleski had arranged for a quitarist to provide








St. Patrick's Day

Communications Committee Update

The Communications Committee (Joan Bancroft-Grody, Bud Henderson and Mary Carlson), in concert with the Board of Directors, has been diligently investigating the options available for IBC internet services. Unfortunately, they have concluded that there is no good option, yet, for community wide internet services. This is a rapidly changing technology and rather than tie in to old technology and pricing, even Comcast recommended not using their bulk internet, a decision on internet had been postponed. Owners are still to arrange their own service.

However, through this process, the Committee found that Comcast was willing to offer upgraded TV service at reduced pricing. Our current, low end, TV package has two remaining years but Comcast offered an HD package with enhanced channels and HD service that includes the HD boxes at no charge. This offering will cover the two remaining years of the current contract plus five additional years. This enhanced offering will cover at least two HD boxes per unit at IBC.

Projected savings from this offering is over \$4,500 by the end of the current contract.

Comcast will offer pricing breaks if you already have your HD boxes. Otherwise, owners will need to trade in your boxes at your next visit.

IBC Building wiring remains an issue to be solved if you have unit problems with the Comcast services. They will often work with the owner to resolve unit issues.

A huge thanks to Joan for all of her efforts on this.
